When I woke up from the surgery, I thought it was gonna be pain free for the most part. But once the nerve block wore off, I got fooled a little bit. It actually hurt. But in five days, the pain was gone.

I wore a sling for the first month, and I think for the first three weeks, I didn't spend much time roaming around outside. But as it gradually got more comfortable, you take it out of the sling for a little while, have to sleep with it every night for a while. But as it moved around a little more, it got a little more comfortable. And then I started therapy, oh, probably three weeks after having the surgery where they were just light moving it around.

## **GRANT FUHR:**

I assumed that I would get probably 70 or 80% back and it would be semi-pain free. But I've got probably almost 100% more than I thought I was gonna get and I've got no pain. So for me, it's been a win-win.
